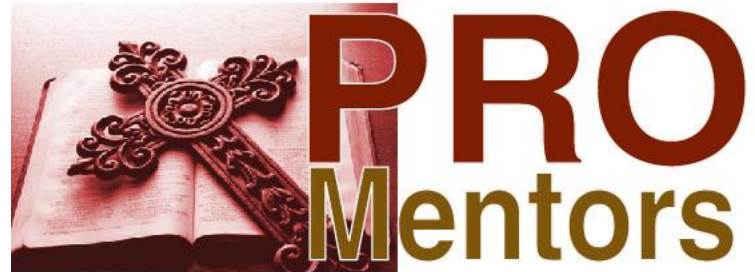

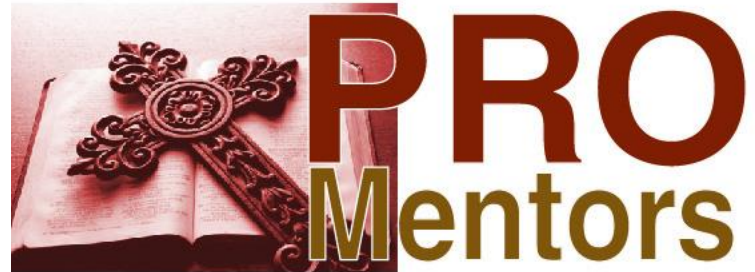

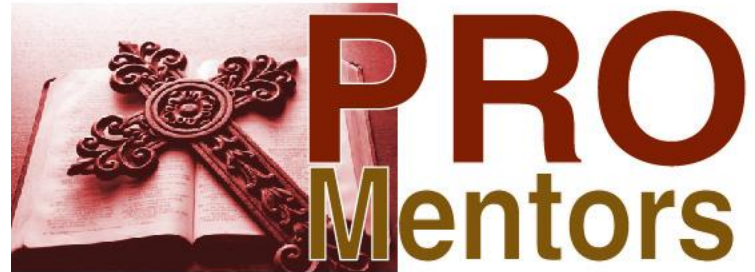

California's Solution

AB109: The Public Safety Realignment Act

- changes the definition of a felony
- shifts housing for lower level offenders from prison to local jail
transfers supervision of designated parolees from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to Probation.
- Felons who have committed non-violent, non-serious and non-sex offenses (N3) will be housed in local jail.
- Those released from state prison, Post Release Offenders (PRO), will be supervised by Probation.
- Offenders in these two groups will utilize county funded substance abuse, mental health and other services in the community.

Prisons in America

2008: 1 in 100 people in America in jail or prison

Most Recent info says .73% in Prison (not behind bars)

Other statistics suggest 1 in 32 are in prison or under supervision (3.1%)

One thing is clear: the US incarcerates more people than any other country in the world.

- 5% of the world's population
- 25% of the world's prison population

Prisons in America

Four reasons for incarceration:

1. Public Safety
2. Punishment
3. Rehabilitation
4. Deterrence

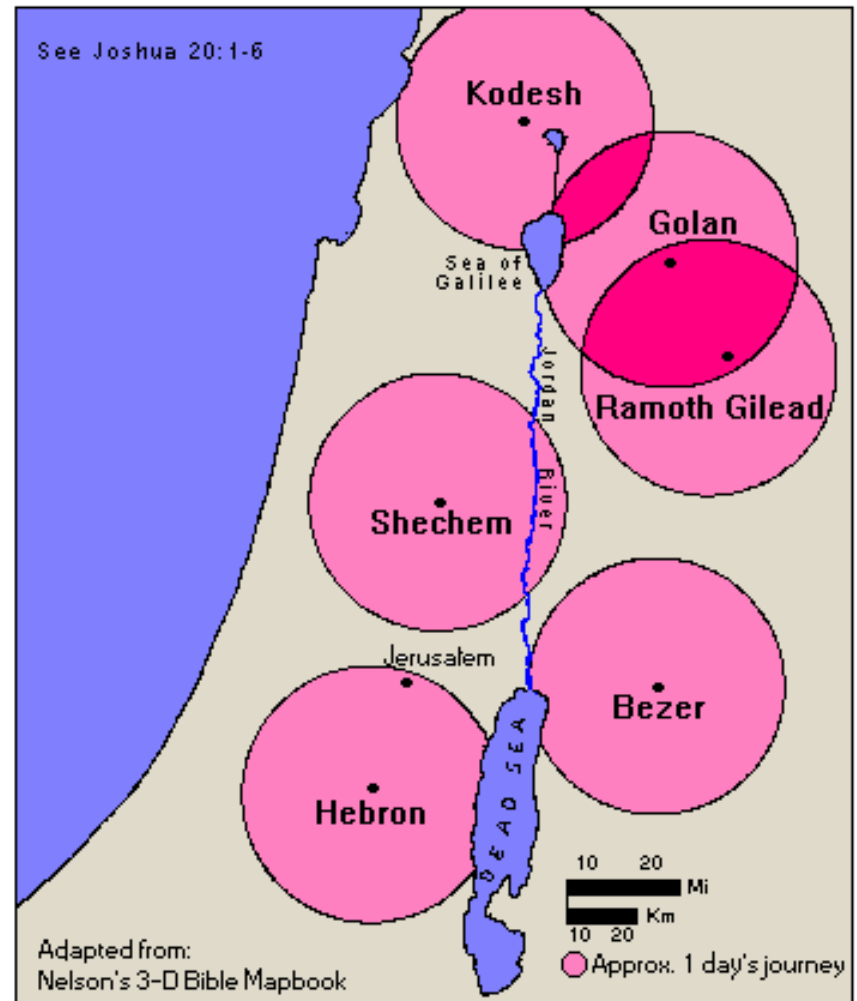
What does the Bible Say?



Joshua 20:1-5

Then the LORD said to Joshua, ² “Say to the people of Israel, ‘Appoint the cities of refuge, of which I spoke to you through Moses, ³ that the manslayer who kills any person without intent or unwittingly may flee there; they shall be for you a refuge from the avenger of blood. ⁴ He shall flee to one of these cities and shall stand at the entrance of the gate of the city, and explain his case to the elders of that city; then they shall take him into the city, and give him a place, and he shall remain with them. ⁵ And if the avenger of blood pursues him, they shall not give up the slayer into his hand; because he killed his neighbor unwittingly, having had no enmity against him in times past.

Leviticus 6:1-5

The LORD said to Moses, ² “If any one sins and commits a breach of faith against the LORD by deceiving his neighbor in a matter of deposit or security, or through robbery, or if he has oppressed his neighbor ³ or has found what was lost and lied about it, swearing falsely—in any of all the things which men do and sin therein, ⁴ when one has sinned and become guilty, he shall restore what he took by robbery, or what he got by oppression, or the deposit which was committed to him, or the lost thing which he found, ⁵ or anything about which he has sworn falsely; he shall restore it in full, and shall add a fifth to it, and give it to him to whom it belongs, on the day of his guilt offering.

**If not in the Bible,
why incarceration?**

For most of history, imprisoning has not been a punishment in itself, but rather a way to confine criminals until a punishment (often corporal or capital punishment) was administered. There were prisons used for detention in Old Testament times, and the Bible details the imprisonment of Joseph in Egypt

The modern prison system was born in London in the 19th Century. The notion of prisoners being incarcerated as part of their punishment and not simply as a holding state until trial or hanging, was at the time revolutionary. This is when prisons had begun to be used as criminal rehabilitation centers.



Eastern State Prison in Philadelphia:

The world's first true "penitentiary," a prison designed to inspire repentance in the hearts of convicts. All prisoners were placed in solitary cells, with light only coming from the ceiling, to keep them "looking to God".

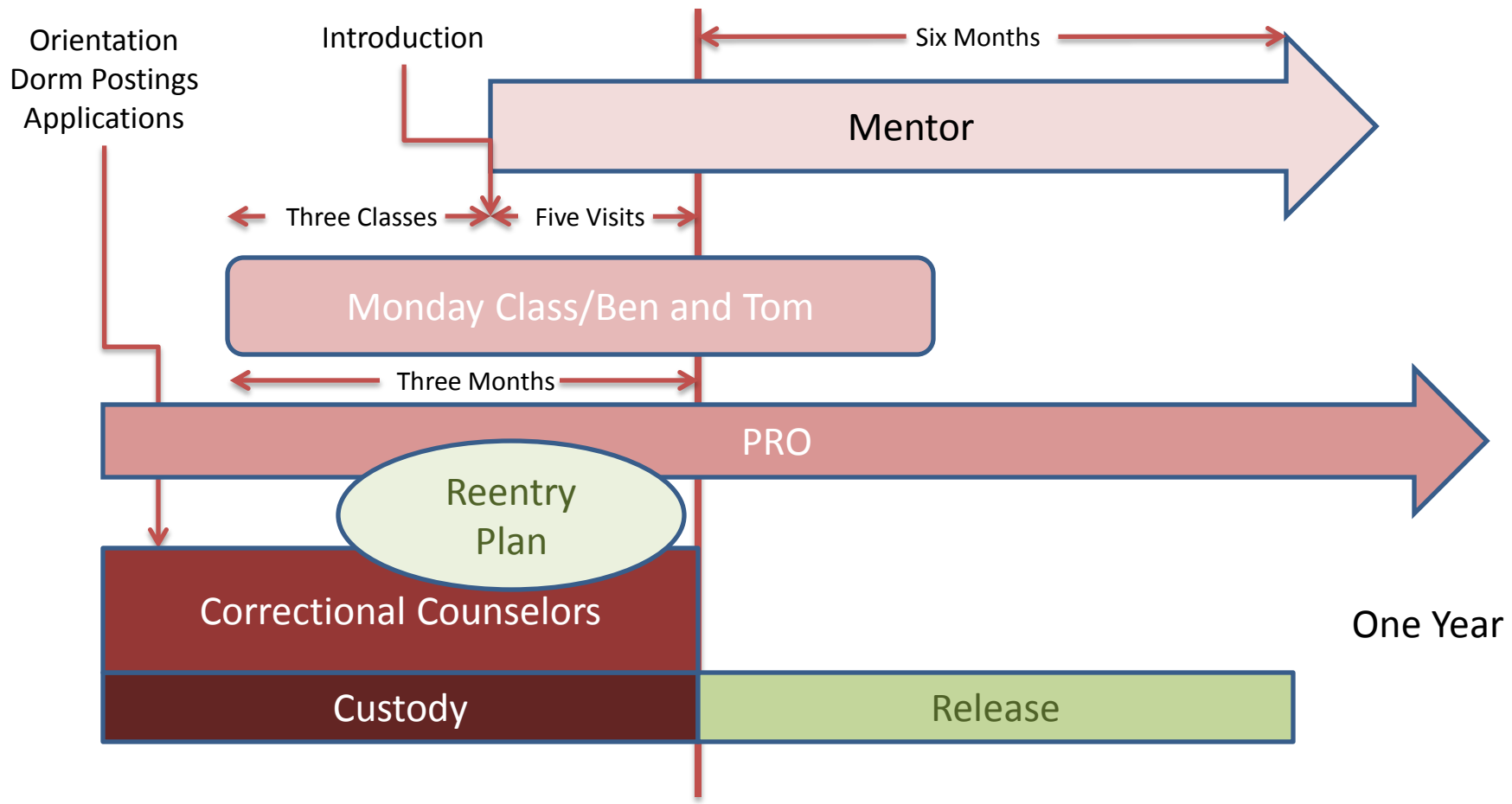

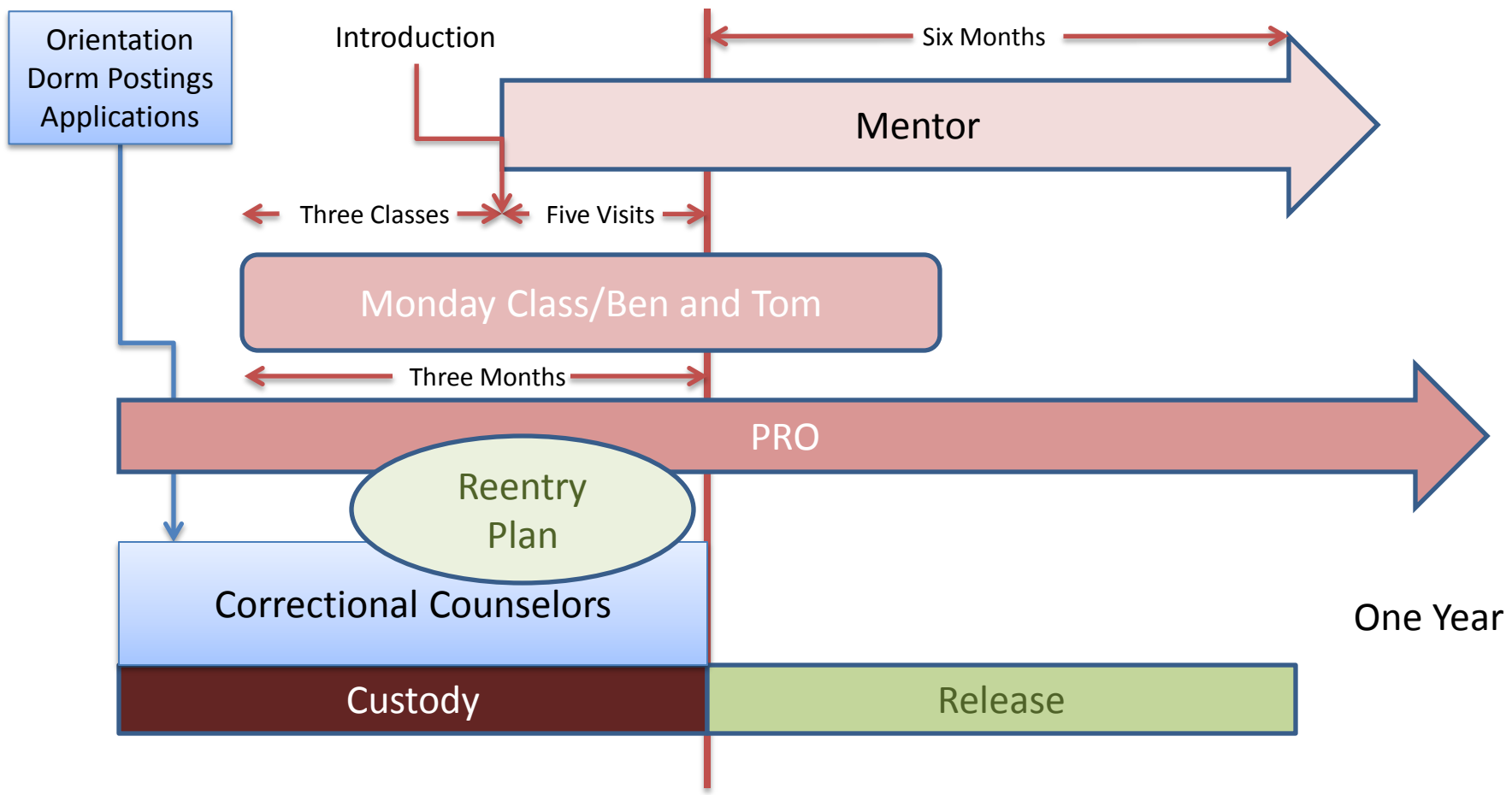

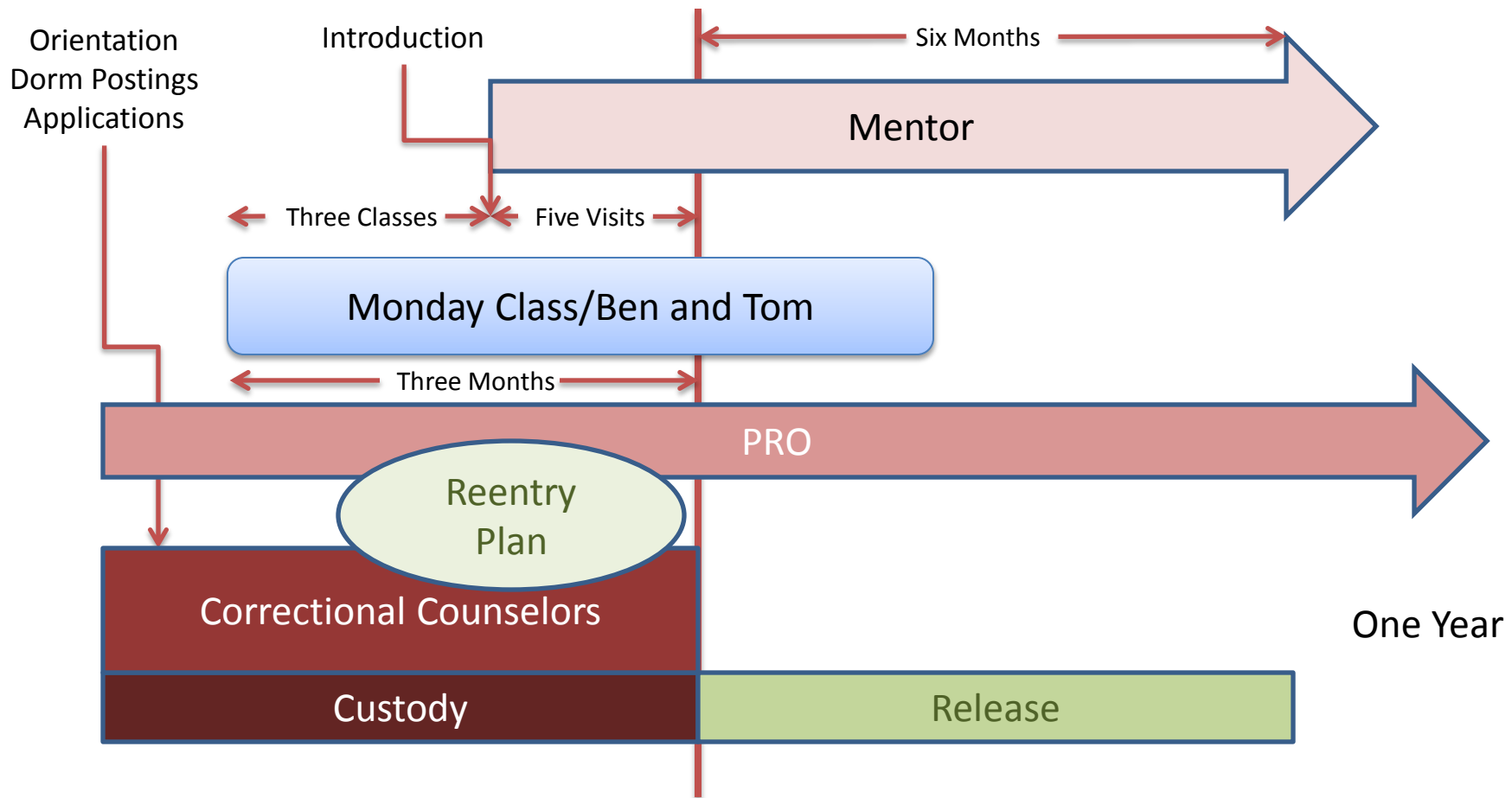

A Christian Mentoring Initiative

- I. I will attend the PRO Mentors class on Monday afternoons (twice monthly) unless prevented by a schedule conflict, and will notify Tom and Ben when a conflict occurs.
- II. During class, I will ask permission to leave the room to use the restroom. There is no other reason to leave the room.
- III. I will remember that my mentor is a volunteer who gives freely of his time to help me.
- IV. I will not expect my mentor to provide a job, housing, or financial assistance.
- V. Upon release and for the following six months, I will expect to meet face-to-face with my assigned mentor weekly

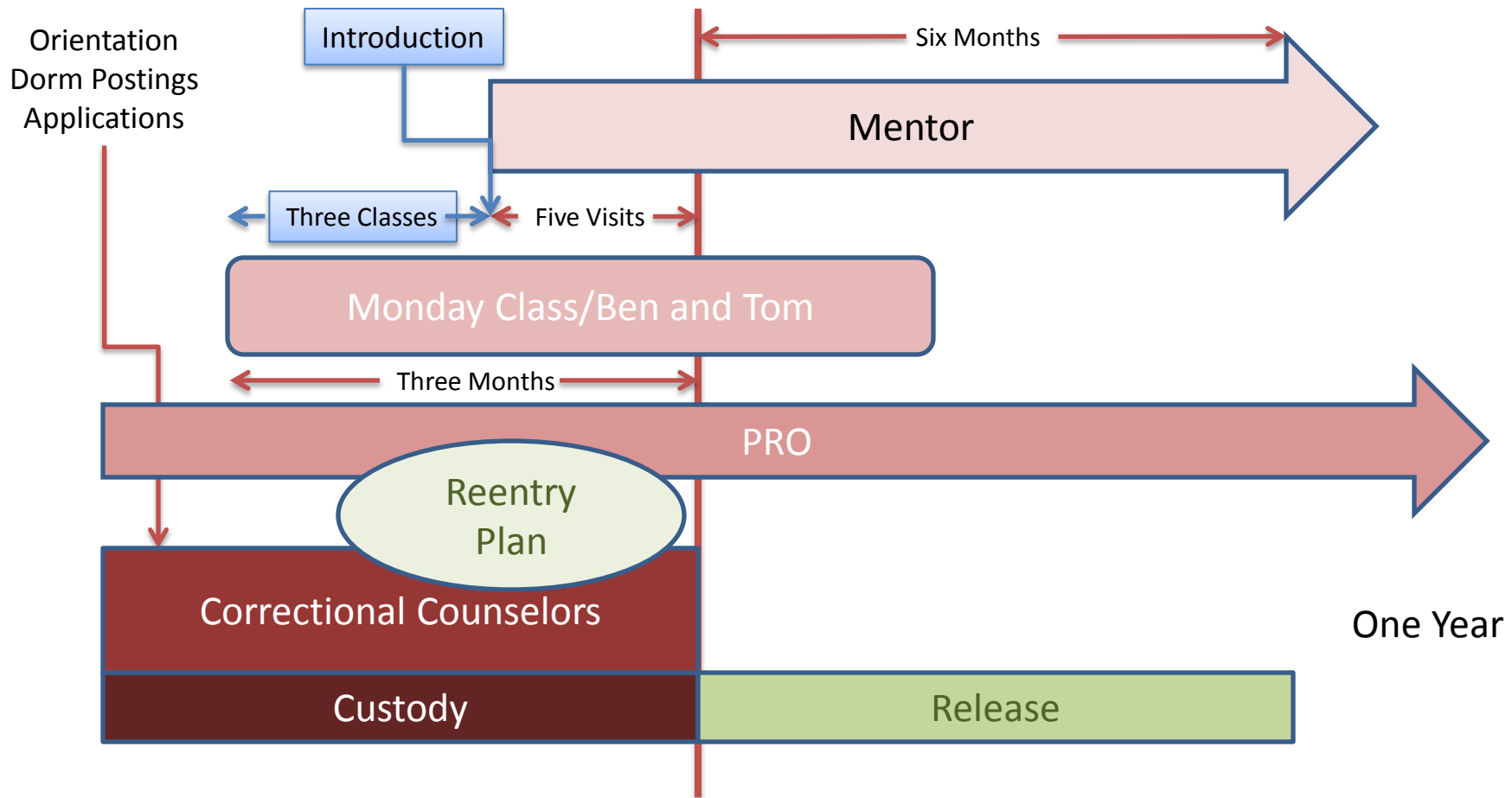

- VI. If circumstances prevent face-to-face meeting, I will have voice contact with my mentor at least weekly.
- VII. I will not ask my mentor for his home and/or business address.
- VIII. I will communicate with Tom or Ben if there is any sort of difficulty between my mentor and me.
- IX. I will regularly attend Christian church services, as well as any other meetings required by my Probation conditions.
- X. Remembering that this ministry is a Christian program, I will look toward Christ (not my mentor) as my Comfort, Healer, and Reconciler.

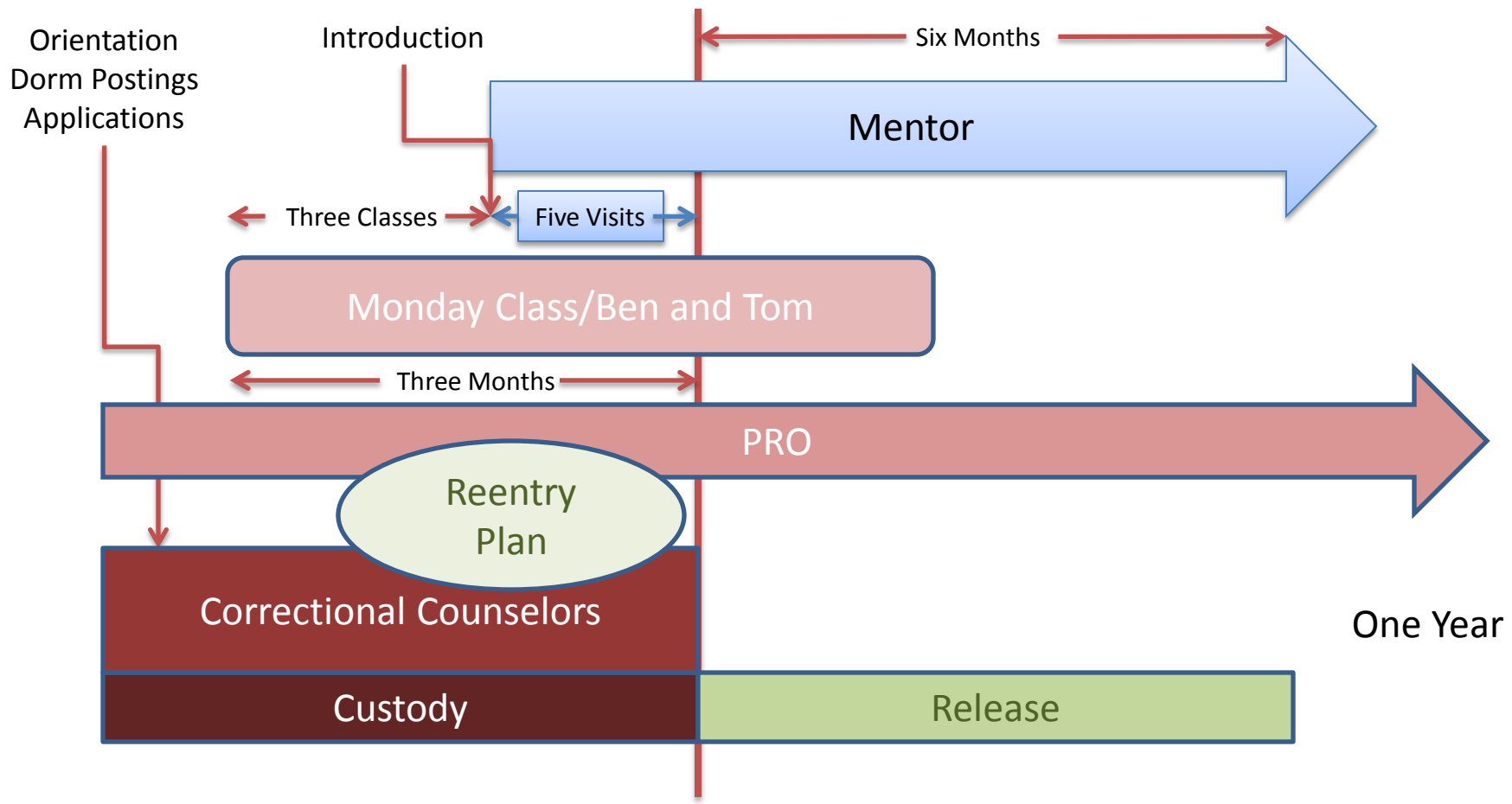

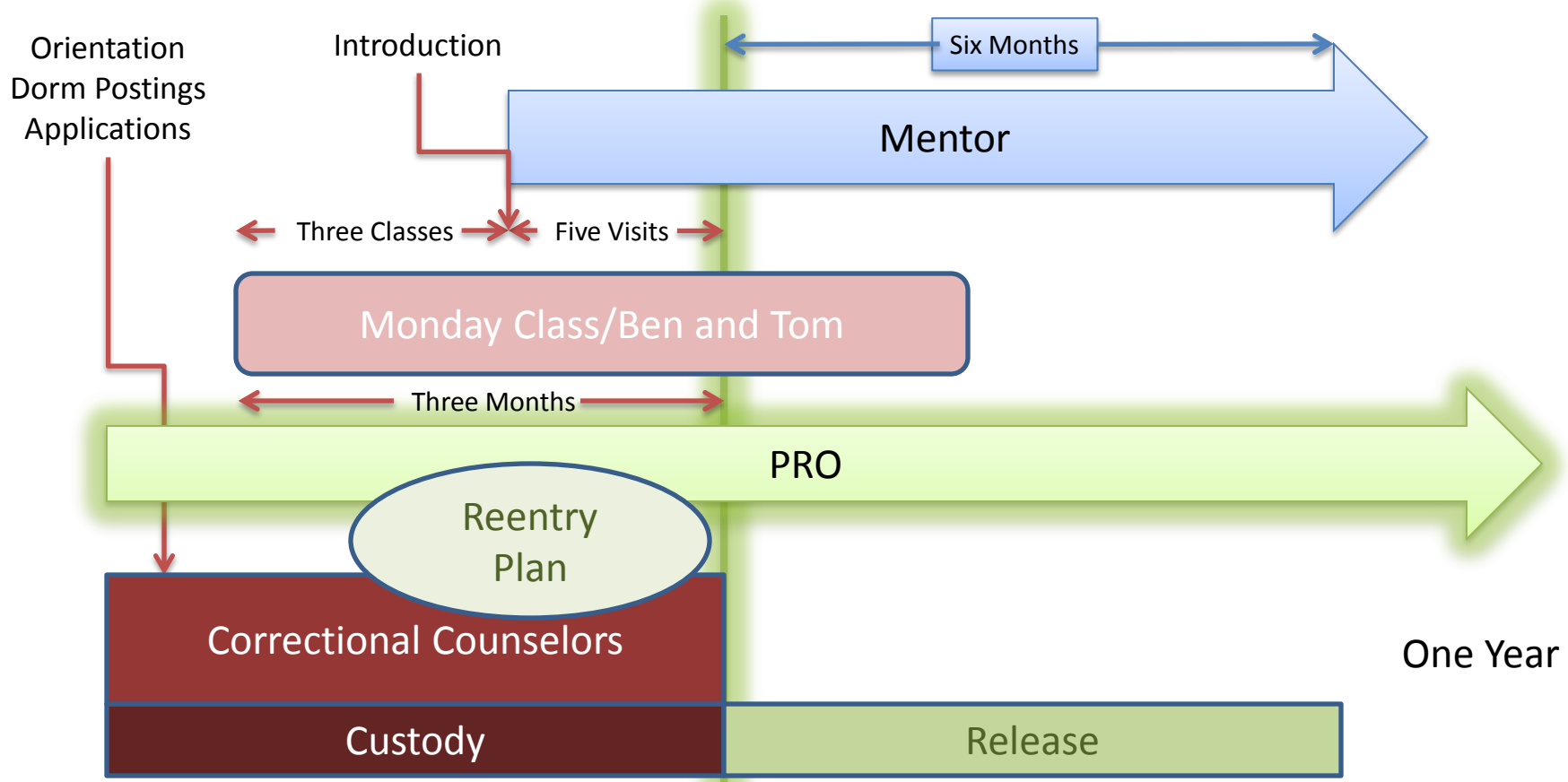

The 10 Commandments of the PRO Mentors Ministry



A Christian Mentoring Initiative

- I. I will contact my PRO while in custody via email once a week.
- II. I will visit my PRO while in custody to develop rapport as often as possible.
- III. When visiting a PRO in custody, I will obey all posted rules and all instructions from the deputies.
- IV. I will not ask a PRO about his crime.
- V. Upon release and for the following six months, I will meet face-to-face with my PRO weekly

The 10 Commandments of the PRO Mentors Ministry

- VI. If circumstances prevent face-to-face meeting, I will have voice contact with my PRO at least weekly.
- VII. I will not share my home and/or business address with my PRO.
- VIII. I will provide monthly (or more frequent, if necessary) updates to the PRO Ministry.
- IX. I will encourage my PRO to live by the law of the land, and if I learn of a violation, I will require the PRO to report it to the proper authority.
- X. Remembering that this ministry is a Christian program, I will point my PRO toward Christ as his Comfort, Healer, and Reconciler.

Not all persons in the custody of the San Diego Sheriff's Department are eligible for visit reservations via eVisit.

Visits are scheduled on a first come, first served basis and are subject to change without notice. Reservations can be made one day prior depending on availability. If available, same day visits may be scheduled with the exception of the East Mesa Reentry Facility and Facility 8 Detention Facility.

When scheduling, you will have to enter correct and current address, ID info and phone numbers for all visitors over 18. This information is mandatory in order to schedule using eVisit. This information is not required for visitors under 18 while using eVisit. As mentioned before, all visitors over 16 are required to have an ID when they arrive for the scheduled visit. Please have this information ready when you are scheduling.

San Diego Sheriff's visitation terms and conditions

You will not be able to schedule a visit if you have been released from custody within the past 90 days.

If you have previously been convicted of a felony and served time in state prison, you may not enter the grounds of a county jail without the permission of the Facility Commander. That permission should be obtained in writing before attempting to schedule a visit. Entry to the facility grounds without such permission is a felony (California Penal Code 54571).

If you are on probation, Watch Commander approval is necessary to visit.

An excessive pattern of late arrivals for visits will result in the loss of phone reservation privileges or the suspension of visits. While we attempt to honor all visit reservations, visits may be changed or cancelled without notice.

Also, changes in the inmate's housing assignments may automatically cancel a scheduled visit.

Visits will **NOT BE SCHEDULED** if the inmate has been previously scheduled for court on the same date.

Visitors must check in together **ONE HOUR** before the scheduled visit. If a visitor is late, the visit may be cancelled.

A **maximum of 3 visitors** (including children) may visit an inmate at any one time. Inmates are allowed only one visit per day.

Minors must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian.

Visit times are subject to **change or cancellation** due to facility security or disciplinary reasons.

Disabled access visiting areas are available. If you have special needs, you must call the visitation line and inform the operator when you make your request.

There is no expectation of privacy in a jail facility. Social visits may be monitored or recorded.

- The PRIMARY VISITOR for this visit must be at least 18 years of age.
- Visitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian.
- All Visitors over 16 must have a valid ID at the time of the visit.
